We understand and appreciate that your sacrifices have come at a cost to you and your families. We want to make you aware of information and services that are available to you outside of the military.

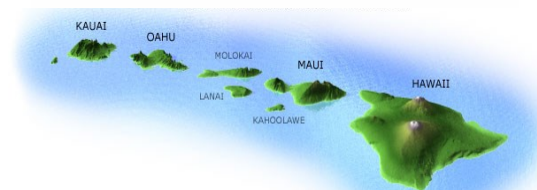

The Pacific Disabilities Center is contracted by the State of Hawai'i, Department of Health, Developmental Disabilities Division, Neurotrauma Supports, to oversee this project.

The Hawai'i Neurotrauma Registry Project works to better the lives of Hawai'i residents of all ages who have had a traumatic brain injury (including concussions), stroke, and / or spinal cord injury, and their families and other supports. It is for everyone on all islands in the state of Hawai'i, regardless of military status, age, or any other factors.

It is critically important for the State of Hawai'i, Department of Health, Neurotrauma Supports to understand what the highest priority needs of individuals with neurotrauma injuries are.

The information provides guidance for understanding and prioritizing the needs of Hawai'i's residents of all ages who have had a stroke, traumatic brain injury or concussion, and / or spinal cord injury. It will help to determine what services and policies are needed the most.
